It promotes and boosts individual and institutional capabilities to strengthen the state, modernize Public Administrations and improve the quality of democracy.

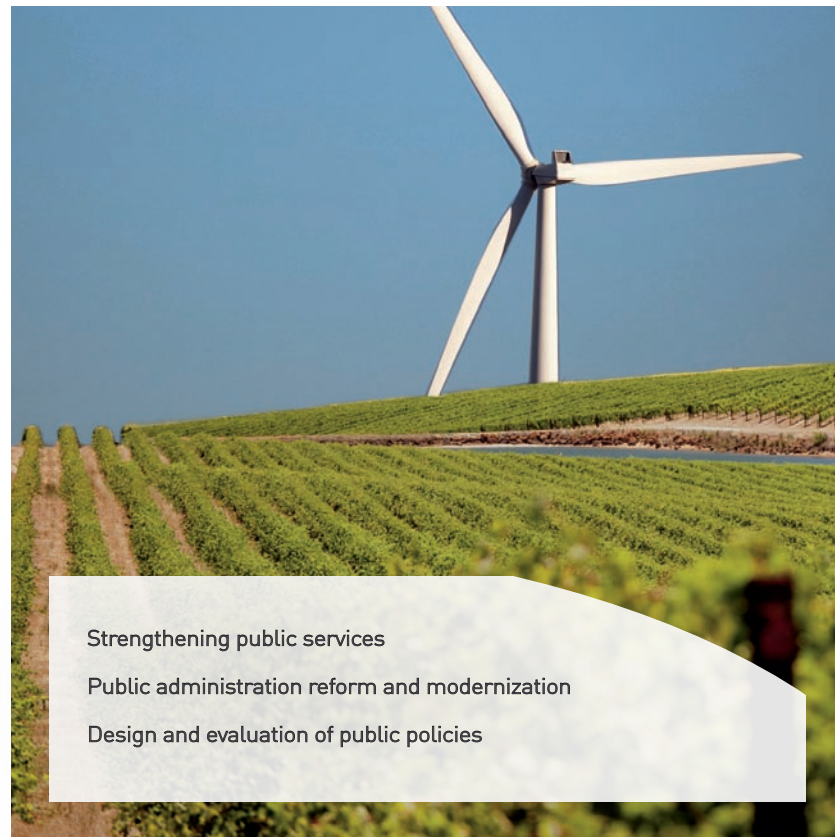
The FIIAPP speeds up and facilitates the participation of the public administrations in technical assistance projects and programs.

TWINNING PROGRAMME

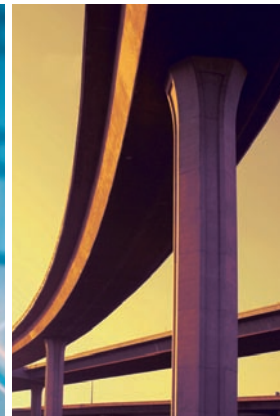

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND INFORMATION EXCHANGE (TAIEX)

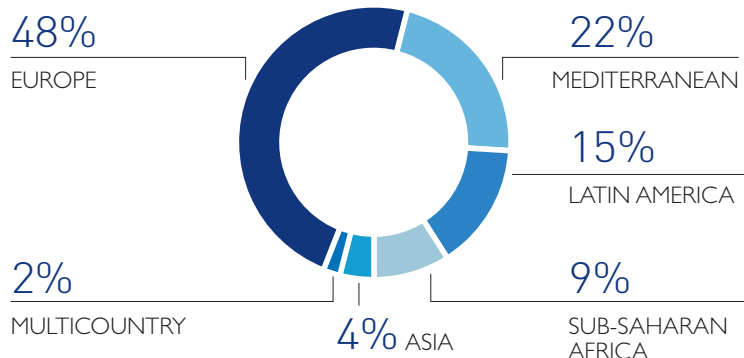
TAIEX provides candidate and pre-candidate countries and European Neighbourhood Policy partners with short-term technical assistance in adapting to the various regulations of the European Union.

NETWORKING

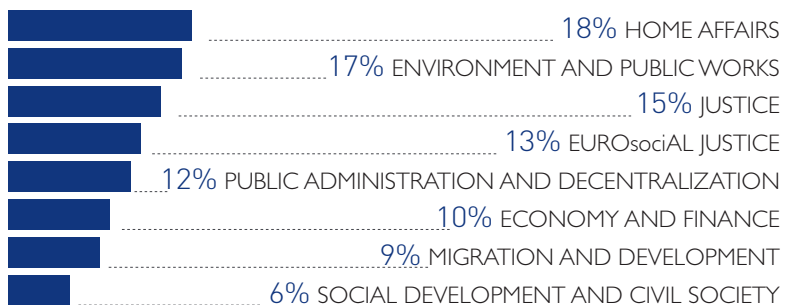
The FIIAPP has a very active presence in EUNIDA, a network of European agencies with a public mandate to design, manage and execute development cooperation programmes. EUNIDA was created to exchange information and combine efforts in managing projects mainly financed with European funds. It arose with the vocation of contributing to the "europeanisation" of technical cooperation and to form a block to which the European Union could turn to carry out technical assistance programmes and projects.
